Objective of the Charity:

To maintain, repair, restore, preserve, improve, beautify and reconstruct for the benefit of the public the fabric of the Church of St Mary the Virgin, Dedham its monuments, fixtures, fittings, furniture, stained glass,

ornaments and other chattels and its churchyard. In addition, the Society may support any charitable purpose in the parish of Dedham that promotes the whole mission of the said Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical.

Membership

In 2022 our membership was 150, and in the previous year 149.

We have taken the decision to discontinue membership cards. They served no practical purpose, and we will reduce the administrative burden and save waste.

The Friends' annual drinks party was held in August with a delightful evening in the garden of the Lecture House, very kindly hosted by Ian and Jill Hunter, and we extend our thanks to them. In September a number of members enjoyed a visit to Waddesdon Manor.

Main Donations 2022

There were no major donations in 2022. The remaining window shelves in the church were fitted with upstands in readiness for any future inscriptions that may be required.

Future Church Fabric Needs

The quinquennial review of the church fabric was finally delivered towards the end of 2022. As with previous quinquennial reports, this has highlighted the need for repairs to the windows and we understand the extent of this work is currently being explored in more detail. It is hoped the work will commence in 2024. The Friends have been asked by the PCC to support the cost of the repairs, at present unknown but expected to be substantial. Following a request from the organ committee to contribute to its fund we have confirmed we will make a donation when they reach the final stages of their target.

Fund Raising Activities

We were delighted to be able to hold the 2022 Dedham Ball at the Talbooth, a welcome return to normality after a break of two years. This was an enjoyable and successful event raising over £9,500.

Financial Review

As reported last year, David Druitt resigned as Treasurer and has been replaced by Sara Marshall. I would like to thank David again for all his work as Treasurer. The change gave us an opportunity to re-organise our banking arrangements and when all the many and tedious hiccups had been resolved Sara officially took over the role. The financial performance for

the year is provided in the accounts prepared by Sara and independently examined by Philip Strangward.

Future Events

The 2023 Dedham Ball will be held on Friday 23 June, again at the Talbooth. The summer members' drinks party will be held on the evening of Thursday 17 August, the venue to be announced in due course. Details of a visit to the Thursford Christmas Spectacular on Friday 8 December have been circulated to members. It is also hoped to arrange a visit later in the year to the highly-regarded Martin's Lane Vineyard in the Crouch Valley.

Trustees

I retire and offer myself for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

During the year we welcomed Amanda Brebner as a new Trustee and she is standing for election.

Since the year end Paul Brebner has replaced Linda Redlich as PCC Representative.

I would like to thank the committee and all our members for their continued support and look forward to seeing you at the Annual General Meeting.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of the Friends of Dedham Church Charity

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2022 which are set out on pages 1 to 5.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year (under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is needed.

It is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under section 145 of the 2011 Act;
- to follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act; and
- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair' view and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below

Independent examiner's statement

In connection with my examination, no matter has come to my attention which gives me reasonable cause to believe that in any material respect that the requirements

- to keep records in accordance with section 130 of the 2011 Act; and
