## Objective of the Charity:

To maintain, repair, restore, preserve, improve, beautify and reconstruct for the benefit of the public the fabric of the Church of St Mary the Virgin, Dedham its monuments, fixtures, fittings, furniture, stained glass, ornaments and other chattels and its churchyard. In addition, the Society may support any charitable purpose in the parish of Dedham that promotes the whole mission of the said Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical.

### Background

This has been a difficult year with all our lives affected in some way by the effects of Covid 19 and its ensuing restrictions, which of course have had a big impact on the activities of the Friends. Once again we are holding our AGM by Zoom, unable to meet together in person. We hope that later in 2021 life will return to something more like normality.

## Membership

In 2019 our membership rose to 164. However during 2020 that number declined to 151 and very sadly during the year five of those members died, leaving us with a current membership of 146. With the return of at least some of our activities later this year we hope to have the opportunity to encourage and welcome new members.

#### **Main Donations 2020**

During 2020 work on the installation of the hospitality unit and toilets in the church was finally completed. The Friends made a significant contribution of just under £32,000 (net of VAT) to the cost of this.

The Friends also received a request from the Primary School for help with the cost of streaming equipment. This was urgently required for relaying assemblies to the various classes during the Covid restrictions. It will also assist in future with other activities such as school plays and concerts, when parents and families are unable to attend due to work or other commitments. The Friends made a contribution of £1,500.

#### **Future Church Fabric Needs**

By the time this report is distributed work on the church gutters should be almost complete. The Friends have agreed to contribute up to 2/3rds of the cost of this to a maximum of £10,000.

Research is under way in relation to the replacement of the church boiler and we await further information on this.

A major item under consideration since the formation of the Friends in 2004 has been the repair of the stained glass windows, several of which are in a poor state. We hope that progress will soon be made with this important matter.

## **Fund Raising Activities**

Unfortunately it was not possible to hold any of our planned fund raising activities in 2020 due to the Covid 19 restrictions.

#### Financial Review

The financial performance for the year is provided in the accounts prepared by David Druitt, and Independent Examiner Philip Strangward. Income during the year was severely reduced due to the absence of fund raising activities and consisted mainly of members' subscriptions and a few donations.

#### **Future Events**

The committee took the decision earlier this year to postpone the next Dedham Ball until 2022 and we have arranged a date of Friday 20 May with Le Talbooth. We sincerely hope that later this summer we will be able to hold a garden drinks party for members. Further details will be announced in due course, and of any other activities we are able and permitted to organise.

#### **Trustees**

Trustees who have served during the year are detailed in this report. Those retiring, and all offering themselves for re-election, are Jayne Anderson, David Druitt, Jill Strangward, Kevin Taylor and Suzanne Woods.

As you are aware, last year Peter Wilson resigned as a Trustee and as Chairman and Peter Rowles resigned as a Trusteee and I thank them for all their work and support. Although not a Trustee, Jean Flewin resigned in 2020 as our Minutes Secretary and I would like to express to her the gratitude of the Trustees for all her help over very many years. Suzanne Woods has kindly stepped into the breach until we are able to find a replacement.

This has not been the best year to assume the role of Chairman, but I would like to thank the committee and our members for their continued support through this very difficult time and hope that we can all meet together in person later in the summer.

The grant to the PCC for new toilets and hospitality unit was for a gross amount of £37,435. The net cost shown above of £31,561 is stated after taking the benefit of a refund of VAT totalling £5,874. The PCC were able to reclaim the VAT paid on the invoices for this work under the Listed Places of Worship Scheme and they returned the proportion relating to the Friends grant to them. This is not exactly 20% of the total paid by the Friends as some elements of the project did not qualify under the Scheme. £5,472 was received during the year and £402 is shown as a debtor in the Balance Sheet to be reclaimed in 2021.

#### Muniment Room book purchase & repairs

Donation received to support Dedham Church Muniment Room Library

#### PCC Hospitality & Toilet Project

£14,619 had been raised in prior periods towards the cost of replacing the existing hospitality facilities of the church and creation of an inside toilet. As commencement of the project had been delayed the funds were set aside as restricted. The project was completed during the year and a total grant made of £37,435 as shown in Note 2 b). The balance of the restricted fund was released against this expenditure.

#### 6 Payments to trustees and related parties

With the exception noted below regarding the independent examiner, there were no disclosable transactions in respect of trustees or persons closely connected to them, nor other related parties.

#### 7 Sales and stock of Christmas cards

There was a stock of 27 packs of cards brought forward from the previous year (2019 - 37) at a total cost value of £104. 12 packs were sold in the year leaving a stock of 15 to be carried forward into 2021 at a value of £42.

#### 8 Independent examiner

In the accounts for year ended 31 December 2015 it was noted that the wife of the independent examiner, Mrs Jill Strangward, had become a member of the trustees. It was to put to the AGM following whether this could be regarded as impinging on his independence as an examiner. It was dismissed as a concern at the AGM and he has been re-appointed in the following years. His fee for the current year is £300 (2019 - £300). He has offered himself for re-appointment for the forthcoming year.

#### Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of the Friends of Dedham Church Charity

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2020 which are set out on pages 1 to 6.

#### Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year (under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is needed.

It is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under section 145 of the 2011 Act;
- to follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act; and
- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

#### Basis of independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair' view and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.
